Rochester, NY (August 18, 2025)—Visual Studies Workshop (VSW) announces **Refocus: Celebrating Visual Studies Workshop at King Street**, a fundraising event hosted at the organization's new location at 36 King Street on October 4, 2025.

The evening event will celebrate VSW in the organization's dynamic new space in the Susan B. Anthony neighborhood. Presented in open house style, this gala event will include delicious light bites by Susan Plunkett's Fabulous Foods, music featuring Ian Downey on cello, an open bar with drinks by Cheshire, and the opportunity to explore the new *Diasporas are the Landscape* exhibition and VSW's new location. The evening will feature a reimagined silent and live auction experience with VSW-exclusive items including a portfolio of rare Marilyn Monroe gelatin silver prints by Philippe Halsman; NASA images captured during the Apollo missions of 1969–71; a 1974 Joan Lyons lithograph of an American flag bra from *Wonder Woman*; a Robert Rauschenberg-designed poster; and an evening at More Fire Glass Studio for 20 people. live auction will include other fun collectables such as rare whisky, wine and sneakers. Attire is creative casual.

Featuring the work of contemporary artists Samantha Box, Claudia Claremi, and Alida Rodrigues, the exhibition presents a compelling exploration of diasporic identity through photography, film, and installation. Drawing on diverse cultural, linguistic, and geographic perspectives, *Diasporas are the Landscape* examines how real, imagined, and symbolic representations of tropical flora and fauna serve as metaphors for how identity and traditions persist across time and borders. *Diasporas are the Landscape* is curated by Hernease Davis, Assistant Curator at Visual Studies Workshop. VSW was founded in 1969 in Rochester, NY by photographer, educator and curator Nathan Lyons (1930–2016), and became one of the earliest independent, not-for-profit, artist-run spaces in the country. More than 50 years later, the organization's mission is reflected in its core programs: VSW Exhibitions and Salon events, Project Space Artist Residencies, and VSW Press.
